Music Therapy Tip: Shake 'N Stop Activity

We use the Shake 'N Stop activity as a fun and engaging way to work on social interactions and communication skills. This intervention gives each child the chance to call "Stop cues" during the music activity, which the rest of the group follows. It encourages clients to work on listening to their peers and parents, maintaining continued focus and attention, sharing and waiting their turn. And this is all done while creating a unique musical experience using instruments and their voices. Instruments used in this music



therapy task are percussion eggs, jingle cubes, percussion animals, maracas, jingle bells, and tambourines. The goal of this task is to teach clients to "Stop" when they hear a parent or caregiver say this in a parking lot or in any place that may be considered unsafe.
